

USGA EXEMPTION EVENT

The winner of the VSGA Amateur Championship will earn automatic qualification into the U.S. Amateur Championship. Additionally, all four

semifinalists will be exempt from local qualifying for the 2026 U.S. Amateur. This year's U.S. Amateur will be held Aug. 11-17 at The Olympic Club in San Francisco. Last year at Hazeltine National in Minnesota, Jose Luis Ballester celebrated his 21st birthday by winning the championship, the Arizona State standout becoming the first Spaniard to win. He became the fourth Sun Devil to win, joining Billy Mayfair, Phil Mickelson, and Jeff Quinney.

- Advanced to U.S. Open final qualifying: Drew Carlin, Gage Foddrell
- Youngest player in the field: John Carlin (15)
- Oldest player in the field: Ken Wren (59)
- The last two champions have either been in high school (Logan Reilly, 2024) or just out of high school (Grayson Wood, 2023). Wood had completed a gap year at an academy in South Carolina before returning to win the Amateur before starting his VCU career. He now plays at Georgia.
- The last time the Amateur was played in the Charlottesville area was in 2015, when Maclain Huge defeated Mark Lawrence Jr. in the final match at Farmington Country Club.
- The last Charlottesville area player to win the Amateur was Scottsville's David Passerell, who defeated Faber Jamerson to win the title at Hermitage Country Club in 2000.
- Birdwood is hosting the Amateur for the second time, but this is the first time the Amateur has been played at the club since Davis Love III's team redesigned the course. Hank Klein topped Mike Grant 1 up in 1990 in the final match at Birdwood.
- Birdwood's club exemption is Dustin Groves, who is an assistant coach for UVA's men's golf team, which recently advanced to the national championship match before falling to Oklahoma State. Groves is a former Wake Forest standout who played and caddied on professional tours before regaining his amateur status.
- UVA graduate Steve Serrao qualified for this championship. The 57year-old has won both the VSGA Junior Stroke Play and the VSGA Senior Amateur during his career. He also advanced to the championship match of the VSGA Senior Amateur when it was held at Birdwood in 2022.
- Serrao is part of the five-player senior (age 50 or older) contingent in the field, joined by Scott Shingler, Steve Lutkehus, Alan Myers, and Ken Wren.
- Preston Burton won the VSGA Junior Stroke Play Championship at Birdwood in 2023. Burton's coach at William & Mary, Tim Pemberton, qualified for the championship and is in the field.
- Two-time finalist Ryan Stinnett earned his spot in the field by pairing with Jason Pool to win the VSGA Four-Ball Championship in May. A former Virginia Tech standout, Stinnett lost to Jay Woodson in 2002 and Billy Hurley III in 2004. No shame in either, as Woodson went on to win another Amateur and four State Opens, and Hurley went on to a long PGA Tour career that included a victory in the 2016 Quicken Loans National at Congressional CC.
