
34TH VSGA JR. MATCH PLAY CHAMPIONSHIP

FIELD NOTES

Herndon's Patrick O'Rourke, who recently graduated from Chantilly High School and will start his career at Christopher Newport University next

month, made a strong run to the final match of last year's Junior Match Play. He won his first three matches without playing past the 15th hole. His run ended with a 2-and-1 loss to Luke Libbey, but O'Rourke (pictured) opened some eyes. The left-hander is one of six players who made the match-play bracket at Olde Mill in the field, joined by Hunter Crist (semifinals), Cameron Sharp and Carson Iroler (quarterfinals), and Braden Hermansky, Grayden Laird, and Pierce Campbell (round of 16).



- Libbey aged out of the championship and recently completed his first season at Liberty University.
- Luca Rinalidi, a rising junior at James River High School in Midlothian, made a recent splash at the State Open of Virginia, finishing at 6-under 204 to earn low amateur honors.
- Sharp, Campbell, Laird, and Jack Skinner were part of the Blacksburg High School team that recently won the National High School championship at Pinehurst Resort.
- Owen Love, a rising junior at Edison High School in Alexandria, won the Virginia High School League's Class 6 Championship in 2024, defeating Robinson's Raquel Walker in a playoff. Love reached the semifinals of the VSGA Amateur at Birdwood Golf at Boar's Head Resort and competed in the recent U.S. Junior Amateur Championship in Texas.
- Though the top three players from the VSGA Junior Stroke Play Championship are not in the field, several others who finished in the top 10 are, including Matthew Hartley (T4), David Goode (T4), Sharp (T6), Jake Lopes (8th), Charles Lange (T10), and Samuel Han (T10).
- There are four sets of brothers in the field: John and Will Carlin, Jacob and Matthew Hartley, Braden and Landon Hermansky, and twins Austyn and Ryan Kim.
- It's been a decade since the stroke-play medalist has won the title in the event, with Mark Lawrence Jr. being the last to do so in 2015.
- The last time the championship match reached the 18th hole in this event was in 2011 when Adam Ball defeated Chas Bassing in 19 holes. It's only reached the 17th hole twice since 2015.
