FIELD NOTES

Bay Creek will welcome a strong field full of past champions, including defending champion Buck Brittain (pictured). Other past champs in the

field include Scott Shingler (2023), Jon Hurst (2022), Cam Young (2018), Rich Buckner (2017), Keith Decker (2013, 2014, 2016), David Partridge (2011, 2015), and Tim Kelley (2012). Brittain is seeking his fourth victory in the event. He's currently one of four players with three Senior Amateur titles. The others are Decker, Richard B. Payne, and E.D. Mustard. Virginia Golf Hall of Famer Moss Beecroft holds the event record with six victories.



- Brittain and Hurst have qualified for the upcoming U.S. Senior Amateur Championship, to be held August 23-28 at Oak Hills CC in San Antonio. The event was originally scheduled to be played at Biltmore Forest outside of Asheville, North Carolina but damage from Hurricane Helene forced relocation. Hurst was medalist at the James River CC qualifier in July, shooting 67. Brittain qualified by posting a 69 at Crystal Falls Lake and Golf Club in Dawsonville, Georgia in June.
- There are four senior "rookies" in the field, all having turned 50 this
 year: Jason Pool, Jeff Spears, Allen Morrison, and Greg Gerczak. Pool
 teamed with Ryan Stinnett to win the VSGA Four-Ball Championship
 in May and is a past VSGA Amateur finalist. Fun fact: Both Pool and
 Stinnett lost to former PGA Tour player Billy Hurley III in an Amateur
 championship match.
- Hurst is looking to become the first player to win both the Senior Stroke Play and Senior Amateur in the same year since Decker in 2014.
- At 70, Roanoke's Jack Allara is the oldest player in the field. Pool is the youngest.
