FIELD NOTES

The Multi-Format Team Championship is the final event of the VSGA senior season, though there is one more very important event left on the

super senior schedule – the Super Senior Amateur Championship at Winchester Country Club in early October. The brother combo of Steve and Jay (pictured) Serrao are seeking a three-peat and also looking to become the first side to win both the Senior Four-Ball and Senior Multi-Format Team championships in the same year. The Serraos rode a monster two-man scramble round (58) to a three-stroke victory last fall at Lakeside Park Club.



- Paras Pandya, who reached the final of the VSGA Senior Amateur in August, again will team with Scott Bemberis at Lakeside the pair earned runner-up honors last year.
- Buck Brittain and Cam Young will team up, a pairing of VSGA Senior Amateur champions. Brittain topped Pandya at Bay Creek to win his fourth Senior Am title in August. Young won the Senior Am in 2018 at The Golden Horseshoe's Gold Course.
- Dave Williams Jr., a semifinalist at Bay Creek, will pair with Mark McCoy, who finished in 8th at the VSGA Senior Stroke Play Championship at Fredericksburg CC in June.
- Jon Hurst, who won the Senior Stroke Play on his home course, will team with Virginia Golf Hall of Famer Keith Decker. The duo won the inaugural senior title in this event in 2019. Hurst enters the event atop the VSGA Senior Player Rankings.
- In the super senior division, Jack Allara and Jim Woodson will look to continue their recent partner-event success. They are the defending champions in this event, won the Alleghany Amateur in the spring, and won the 70+ division at the VSGA Super Senior Four-Ball Championship at Blacksburg CC in May.
- The other past super senior champion of this event Tim Kelley and Rusty Breeden – are in the field.
- David Partridge, tied for second on the VSGA's all-time wins with with Vinny Giles with 15 victories, will look to add to that total, pairing with Jon Zampedro in the super senior division.
- Jack Catlett and Mike Ligon, who won the 65+ division title at the Super Senior Four-Ball at Blacksburg, are paired together for this championship.
