FIELD NOTES

- Defending champion Michelle Cox, who lives in Allentown, Pennsylvania and played four years at Penn State, qualified for the 2024 U.S. Women's Amateur and ranked third on the PSU roster with a 73.84 stroke average as a senior, including a low round of 68.
- Lauren Clark, who was born in Chesterfield and lived there for 12 years, is a Orlando-based professional and recent Kansas graduate. She began her career at LSU but blossomed in Lawrence, helping the Jayhawks to a spot in the NCAA championship. She led KU with a 72.5 scoring average, including a low round of 65 as a senior. She turns 22 on the day of the final round.
- Lauren Greenlief is a seven-time VSGA Women's Golfer of the Year and the winner of the 2015 U.S. Women's Mid-Amateur. A University of Virginia graduate, Greenlief won one of her three VSGA Women's Amateurs at Farmington in 2018.
- Chatprapa Edell is a teaching professional in Chesapeake who made 22 starts on the Epson Tour in 2023.
- Two active UVA golfers (Kennedy Swedick and Kiera Bartholomew) are in the field, as is Cavaliers' signee Elsie MacCleery, a past VSGA Junior Girls' champion.
- Katie Vu had a standout season as a freshman at North Carolina last season, averaging 73.82 strokes over 22 rounds in eight events. She entered the starting lineup for the ACC Championship and NCAA Regional and was the Heels' second-best finisher at the Norman Regional.
- Kathryn Ha has been named VSGA Junior Girls' Golfer of the Year the last two years. A Vanderbilt signee, she won last year's VSGA Junior Girls' title, advanced to the round of 16 at the U.S. Girls' Junior, and lost to champion Lauren Greenlief in the quarterfinals of last year's VSGA Women's Amateur.
- Virginia Tech is represented by current player Alina Ho and incoming signee Emerson B. Dever, who qualified for the 2024 U.S. Girls' Junior and won the 2024 Lanto Invitational girls' title.
- Howard University's Paris Fieldings was the Northeast Conference individual medalist and earned an invite to the NCAA Charlottesville Regional as an individual. She won the Southwest Airlines Showcase last fall, closing with a final-round 66.
- **Jillian Drinkard** is a teaching professional at Farmington. She was Division III national player of the year her senior season at Methodist University and was low professional at last year's Women's Open.
- Clare Connolly is a two-time winner of the Maryland Women's Amateur and a two-time U.S. Women's Mid-Amateur quarterfinalist.
