FIELD NOTES

The VSGA Women's Four-Ball Championship visits the greater Washington D.C. area for the first time as Mount Vernon hosts the event as part of its celebration of America's 250th birthday. Mount Vernon is the only country club built on land that was part of George Washington's original five farms. Lauren Greenlief (pictured) will look to win her fifth title in this event with a third different partner, having won previously with Alexandra (Austin) Grove and Shabril Derco. She'll pair with Jackie Rogowicz to create a formidable duo. Rogowicz is a former Penn State standout who has found success on the national mid-amateur stage, including a round of 32 finish at last year's U.S. Women's Mid-Amateur.



- Standing in the way are the Spicer twins – Jessica Spicer and Sarah Spicer-Baldwin, the defending champions who outdueled Greenlief and Austin for their first title in this event in 2022 at Fawn Lake CC.
- Three sides of Virginians are not participating in this event, and for good reason. They qualified for the U.S. Women's Amateur Four-Ball Championship, which begins the same day as the first day of this event. Those sides are Lilly Hall and Morgan Mussatt; Carter Bransford and Ashnoor Kaur; and Maria Isabella Errichetto and Emerson Roychoudhury. Additionally, VSGA member Julie Shin is teaming up with Bridget O'Keefe. Good luck to all!
- In the Senior Women's Four-Ball Championship, everyone will again try to solve the riddle of how to defeat Amy Ellertson and Natalie Easterly, who have won all seven times they have entered this championship.
- There are some strong challengers, though, including 2024 champions Shawn McCullough and Diane Willkens, who won their title at Spotswood CC.
- Two-time VSGA Senior Women's Amateur winner Kristin Shifflett, who reached the round of 32 at last year's U.S. Senior Women's Amateur, will pair with Bev Lane.
- Home-course knowledge will come into play for Joan Gardner and Katie Cox. Though Cox is now a member at Spotswood, she was a longtime member at Mount Vernon before moving away from the area.
